Little Red Riding Hood

Nouns and Verbs

Nouns

"Little Red Riding Hood" has lots of nouns in it. Nouns are the names of things. For example, Little Red Riding Hood has a red **cloak** and **hood**; she promises her **mother** to stay safe; she takes Grandma a **cake** (these are all nouns).

Verbs

"Little Red Riding Hood" has lots of verbs in it. Verbs are 'doing' words. For example, Little Red Riding Hood **promised** to stay safe, **kissed** her mother goodbye, **set off** and **found** herself in the woods, where a wolf came by (these are all words for the actions).

Below are sentences from the story. One word in each is highlighted. What sort of word is it (a noun or a verb)?
