Sinbad the Sailor Changing Verbs into Nouns

The story Sinbad the Sailor originated many centuries ago. It is included in a <u>collection</u> of classic Arabic stories and has been a favourite children's tale for <u>generations</u>. This abridged <u>version</u> has been adapted from a <u>translation</u> in Tales from 1,000 Nights.

The '*shun*' sound at the end of the underlined words from the Sinbad the Sailor excerpt above has been spelt in different ways **-tion** and **-sion**. Words that end with the suffixes tion and sion are usually nouns used to describe the 'act of' or 'state of' a particular verb.
