## The Magic Shop Powerful Prefixes

For a moment we were alone...There was a tiger in an <u>orn</u>ate glass case that covered the low counter; there were several crystal <u>spher</u>es, a china hand holding magic cards, a stock of magic fish bowls in various sizes, and a huge <u>multi</u>coloured magic hat. On the floor were <u>mir</u>rors; one to draw you out long and thin, one to swell your head and make your legs <u>van</u>ish, and one to make you short and fat.

A **prefix** is a letter or group of letters placed at the beginning of a word. Prefixes are derived from other languages, e.g. Latin or Greek, and have meanings that reflect the word they introduce. The word *prefix* itself even uses the prefix '**pre**' (based on the Latin word 'before'). Let's study the etymology (word origins) of the underlined prefixes in the excerpt above from *The Magic Shop*:

Word	Prefix	Etymology	Other Examples
ornate	orn-	'decorate' (Latin)	ornament
spheres	spher-	ʻball' (Latin)	spherical
multicoloured	multi-	'many' (Latin)	multiple, multi
mirror	mir-	'to wonder at' (Latin)	mirage, miracle
vanish	van-	'empty' (Latin)	vanity
