

REVISION OF PUNCTUATION

Full stops

A quick reminder:

In our writing, when a sentence ends, we show it with a special mark called a '**full stop**'.



Here are some examples:

I lifted up the edge of the bark, and pulled it back. Immediately, spiders ran everywhere. I jumped up. I was too scared to scream. The spiders fell off the bark. Some landed on me. I ran and ran.





You can see that every sentence above ends with a **full stop**. But we don't *always* use a full stop to end a sentence.

If the sentence is written as a question, we put a **question mark** at the end. For example: "What is it**?**" called Dad, running after me.

Another type of mark used at the end of a sentence is an **exclamation mark**. An 'exclamation' is a word, phrase or sentence that shows the author or character has strong emotions, like pain, surprise or anger.

For example: "A s-s-spider!" I yelled.



EXERCISE 1

Here is another passage from the story *Arachnophoebe* but the full stops (12 of them) have been removed. Can you put them back in?
